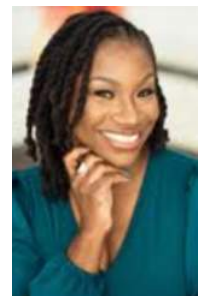

Our wonderful deacons also are U.S. veterans

Veterans Day, November 11, is perhaps our country's most respected and honored holiday as it provides the opportunity to recognize the scores of very brave men and women who selflessly served or are actively serving to protect our nation. St. Mary is proud to have a number of parishioners who have served, and we also list our military soldiers and their families in our bulletin to ask for your prayers. St. Mary's own Deacon Terrence and Deacon Walt are both U.S. veterans. Here are their stories of service:

Deacon Terrence R. Chisolm OF, PRRP, PhD, a native of



Rock Hill, was reared, baptized, and confirmed at Saint Mary Catholic Church. He has spent nearly three decades working with at-risk students and their families, addressing the stigma associated with ongoing psychosocial, spiritual, behavioral, and mental health issues in home and school environments.

Deacon Terrence is a U.S. Army veteran who served for six years. He was part of the United States Army Quartermaster Corps Regiment, trained, and worked as a Budget and Supply Specialist. His assignments included tours of duty with the XVIII Airborne Corps, 50th Signal Battalion Headquarters at Fort Bragg, NC, the 2nd Infantry Division at Camp Greaves, South Korea on the DMZ, and the 11th Transportation Battalion at Fort Story, Virginia Beach. He received advanced training in Supply and Budget Resource Management, Junior Noncommissioned Officer, Combat Medic, Airborne Paratrooper Unit. Awards included Army medals for Good Conduct, and Army Achievement.

In 2013, he was professed into the Franciscan Order (OF), and is a Contemplative Franciscan, and ordained to the Diaconate in 2016. Besides his duties as a deacon and pastoral associate at Saint Mary, he is a Psychiatric Rehabilitation Recovery Practitioner (PRRP) and currently serves as the administrator of the Rock Hill Schools Day Treatment Center.

He has been published in scholarly journals, authored a book, and developed academic programs and two theories for students with social-emotional, behavioral, and academic needs. He specializes in and is trained in Psychiatric Rehabilitation, Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (Group Therapy and Trauma-Focused), Pastoral Counseling, and Emotional and Behavioral Disorders.

Deacon Terrence holds undergraduate degrees from the University of Maryland-UC (Liberal Arts) and Saint Leo University (Sociology), graduate degrees in Business Administration (MBA), Theology (MTh) from Saint Leo University, and Psychiatric Rehabilitation from the University of South Carolina School of Medicine, and a Doctorate (PhD) in Exceptional Student Education from Northcentral University.

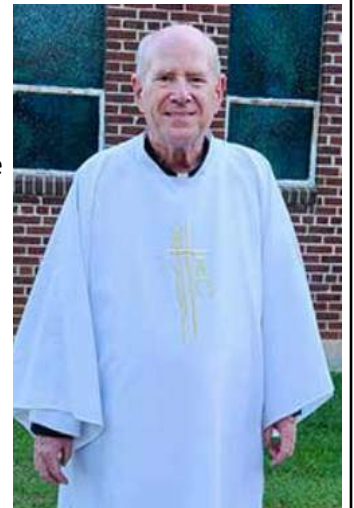


Deacon Walt Hollis began his military service by volunteering for the Naval Air Reserve during the Vietnam War. He was called up and received orders for active duty with Attack Squadron 75, located at NAS Oceana, Virginia Beach, VA. His squadron was deployed onto the USS Kitty Hawk CVA 63 and were at sea for approximately 10 months. "Having always wanting to serve my country, I was blessed to receive two Commendations—one was for assisting in extinguishing a significant fire while at sea during Kason."

Much of Deacon Walt's professional career encompassed being a Senior Project Manager for Arthur Andersen Consulting where he managed and sold operational projects to major multinational corporations.

A calling to the Diaconate, he was ordained in 2002. "My faith and my belief in God tells me that we must all see our lives through our ability to do good works and through those works to lift people up—to help the needy, to care for the poor, and for the elderly!" Relocating where needed is part of the responsibilities of serving as a deacon, and St. Mary is Walt & Barbara's fourth parish. "Barbara and I are so inspired by the love and caring of Saint Mary and appreciate this as being the best parish we have ever served."

Thank you Deacon Terrence and Deacon Walt, for your dedicated service to our country and to St. Mary's.
